SAN ANTONIO CITY OFFICIALS REVIEW DATA THAT SHOWS HURRICANE HARVEY OUTCOME IN SAN ANTONIO

*SARA Provided Preliminary Data Used in Presentation to City Council. Agency to Present
Overall Results at Nov. 15 Board of Directors Meeting*

WHAT: As part of the City of San Antonio's November 1, City Council B Session meeting, the Transportation and Capital Improvements department presented preliminary data that illustrated the flooding risks that could occur in San Antonio should a storm event similar to Hurricane Harvey ever happen locally. The San Antonio River Authority (SARA) managed and funded the work to provide the models used in the presentation that are part of a larger project and includes results focusing on the main stem of the San Antonio River, which is scheduled to be completed later this month. SARA will present the overall results during their November 15 Board of Directors meeting which is open to the public.
