SARA TO PRESENT DATA RESULTS THAT SHOWS HURRICANE HARVEY OUTCOME IN SAN ANTONIO

Agency to Present Results at Nov. 15 Board of Directors Meeting

WHAT: The San Antonio River Authority (SARA) will present results from the modeling data analysis illustrating the flooding risks that could occur in San Antonio should a storm event similar to Hurricane Harvey ever happen locally at the agency's Nov. 15 Board of Directors meeting. SARA managed and funded the flood modeling work focusing on the main stem of the San Antonio River. Preliminary data was first presented by the City of San Antonio's Transportation and Capital Improvements department at the Nov. 1 City Council B Session meeting. SARA's Board of Directors meetings are open to the public.
